The Board of Directors of the Coalton Metropolitan District, Boulder County, Colorado, held a regular meeting via teleconference on December 07, 2023 at 2:30 pm.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present:

Kristopher Barnes, President Gary Rohr, Secretary/Treasurer Karen Bennett, Assistant Secretary Jack Rohr, Assistant Secretary

Also in attendance were Deborah Early, Icenogle Seaver Pogue, P.C.; Jennifer Ondracek, and Max Megliola, Pinnacle Consulting Group, Inc.; Angela Elliot and Evan Redmond, Teleos Management Services; Scott Chomiak, KUH; and members of the public.

Ms. Elliot stated that proper publication was made to allow the Board to conduct a public hearing on the District's 2024 budget. Director Barnes opened the public hearing on the District's proposed 2024 budget. There being no public comment on the District's budget, the public hearing was closed.

Thereupon, Director G. Rohr introduced and moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES, ADOPTING A BUDGET, SETTING FORTH MILL LEVIES, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE GENERAL FUND IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE COALTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, BOULDER COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY 2024, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER 2024,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Coalton Metropolitan District has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body at the proper time; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published on November 17, 2023, in the Boulder Daily Camera, a newspaper having general circulation within the boundaries of the District, pursuant to statute, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on December 07, 2023, and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, whatever increases may have been made in the expenditures, like increases were added to the revenues so that the budget remains in balance, as required by law,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE COALTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICTOF BOULDER COUNTY, COLORADO:

- Section 1. <u>2024 Budget Revenues</u>. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 2. <u>2024 Budget Expenditures</u>. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.
- Section 3. Adoption of Budget for 2024. That the budget as submitted and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted as the budget of the Coalton Metropolitan District for calendar year 2023.
- Section 4. <u>2024 Levy of General Property Taxes.</u> That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the 2024 budget for the General Fund from property taxes for operating expenses is \$138,471. That the 2023 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Boulder County Assessor, is \$2,769,420.

- A. <u>Levy for General Fund</u>. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2024 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 50.000 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2024.
- Section 5. <u>Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits</u>. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.
- Section 6. <u>Certification</u>. The District's accountant is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Boulder County, Colorado, the 50.000 mill levy for the Districts hereinabove determined and set. That said certification shall be in substantially the following form:

Section 7. <u>Appropriations</u>. That the amounts set forth as expenditures and balances remaining, as specifically allocated in the budget attached hereto, are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for the purposes stated and no other.
